My friend said, "Check out Richard Thompson's instrumental cover of Donovan's "Season of the Witch"... I YouTubed it... FAB! Side bar: The Strangelings' cover of the same... and I mean WOW! Bought their CD and a DVD of them in concert... Three women, two guys... spine-tingling harmonies plus electric sitar... a mix of originals and covers.

Josh Antonuccio (a producer and engineer at 3 Elliott Studio and a certified member of the local band Scubadog). Antonuccio submitted a list of his 22 favorite albums of 2010, with some honorable mentions at the end. The 22 are listed in descending order, with the best at the top.

1. Janelle Monae: "The ArchAndroid"

This album defies classification and is one of the most grandiose and exquisitely genrebending releases in recent times. Beckoning on traces of soul, dance, punk, lounge music and R&B, Janelle Monae walks with swagger and style through lands that only folks like Prince and George Clinton once dared to tread. For starters, begin with the masterful James Brown-esque "Tightrope," then allow her to defy your expectations and blow your mind at every turn.

2. LCD Soundsystem: "This Is Happening"

I have to admit that at first this record didn't capture me like 2007's "Sound of Silver" did, but I've really come around as the year has gone by. Once again, channeling the likes of
