14-year-old ignites open stage

Filled with both fire and sensitivity, brashness and humility, Jasper Friend, 14, has ignited some recent local poetry readings. About a month ago, Friend (who reads under the name "Jazzy") decided to take her writings to the spoken word open stage, Tuesday nights at Donkey Coffee. Friend's poems and rants, always heartfelt and passionately delivered, tend to leave little room for interpretation.

Despite using a straightforward, declarative approach for much of her work, Friend's outlook on the world around her is decidedly inquisitive and receptive.

"It's okay for people to have an opinion," she said. "I try to be

open-minded."


That said, Friend is not bashful about the value she places on attempting to influence listeners with the political content of some of her pieces, particularly in poems that address issues of war and social injustice.

"I don't think it's right that people should be blowing up people because they're mad at them," she said. "You can solve problems in other ways besides killing peo-

ple."

Friend said much of her spoken word material came from songs she wrote (but hasn't yet performed) as a way to "vent." She said she enjoys writing and hearing poems that deal with a range of subjects, including family issues and friendships.

"I like all kinds of poems. I respect everyone's work," Friend said. "I really like the idea of seeing how people are liking your

work and seeing what you can improve on. I like to see how many people are actually interested in what I or other poets have to say."

Friend, who plans to pursue an acting career, said she appreciates the various political persuasions of audience members. She said she hopes to reach people by presenting her views in the context of an artistic performances.

"I really like poems that get a message out to you, that flow nicely, and that are meaningful to me and that catch your eye or catch your heart," Friend said.
